THE IMPORTANCE OF KEEPING GOOD RECORDS

Careful record keeping is very important in any breeding program. Whether you have one sow and one boar or 20 sows and 3 boars. Keeping records allows you to see where you've been and make better decisions about where you are heading with your breeding program.

Records that should be kept include: matings, litter size, defects, which animals were culled for market hogs, which animals were retained as breeding stock, sales records, registry numbers and notes on your observations.

Keeping records up to date is much easier than playing catch up later on. It also gives potential buyers a very good impression of you as a breeder and allows them to see that you are conscientious about your stewardship and conservation of the Red Wattle breed.

A simple pocket notebook or a laptop with a spread sheet set up will work. It just depends on your operation. The important thing is that you keep your records up to date and make notes of things that you observe while working with your hogs. For example: if you have a sow that is "grouchy" "irritable" and "snappy". Does she have some physical problem that needs to be treated? or is her temperament just not in line with the RW breed. RW's should be calm. easy going and gentle. If there is a physical problem it should be addressed, if there is no physical problem this sow should be culled to improve the breed.

Litter records let you know when a sow's or a boar's fertility has dropped too low to be

economical. When this happens it is time to choose new breeders and send the older animals for processing. Litter records also let you know farrowing number vs. weaning numbers. After all a sow that farrows large litters but consistently weans small numbers of piglets is not a good prospect for long term breeding. Theresa Scheffelbein, RWHA member came up

Don't let them be lost

All too frequently I get a phone call from someone who has purchased a RW and now wants to register the animal. Unfortunately, they have lost or misplaced the paperwork given to them by the breeder. When this happens I have to tell them to go back to the breeder and request new registration application forms with the proper signatures.

Animals can be "lost" from the system for years when they change hands without being either registered by the breeder of never transferred to in the registry to new owners.

The RWHA recommends that all breeders send in the registration application at time of sale as a courtesy to the new owner and to keep from "losing" these animals from the registry and documentation of the breed.
