## Some Mule-Footed, Some Three-Pronged and Others With Wattles.

Recently the Sunday Post-Dispatch gave an account of a lot of mule-footed hogs being shipped from Kansas City by Col. Gasten.

Edwin T. Guler of Terrell. Tex., writes that he was reared fin Louisiana, and in 1860 the mule-footed hog prevailed in Catahoula Parish, and that by crossing them with other breeds queer results were obtained. The half-breeds were divided in several species, some having the mule foot, some three-pronged feet, and others the single split. These hogs did not yield as pelatable meat as the razor back, nor were they as thrifty. Mr. Guier drove a lot of the mule and three-footed hogs to Mississippl, eighty miles away, and they were regarded as curiosities there, none having been seen that side of the river before.
